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# PRIORITIES OF THE DANISH GOVERNMENT FOR DANISH DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE

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# FOCUS ON FREEDOM

The priorities for Denmark's development assistance in 2012-2016 reflect the ongoing implementation of the Strategy for Denmark's Development Cooperation (2010), "**Freedom from Poverty – Freedom to Change**". With **poverty reduction** as the overarching goal for Danish development policy, the strategy highlights five political priority areas for Denmark's future engagement on development: **1) Freedom, democracy and human rights, 2) growth and employment, 3) gender equality, 4) stability and fragility, and 5) environment and climate**. Annual road maps will outline the implementation of the activities within the five priority areas. The Government will maintain Danish development assistance at the level of DKK 15.2 billion in both 2012 and 2013. In 2012, Danish development assistance is therefore expected to reach the level of approximately 0.8 per cent of GNI. This high level ensures that Denmark continue to be placed among the five countries in the world that meet the UN target of providing at least 0.7 per cent of GNI to development assistance.

## **Stronger focus makes room for new interventions**

A stronger engagement in fewer countries and organisations creates **impact**, better results and room for new initiatives. The phasing out of assistance to partner countries Vietnam, Bhutan, Nicaragua and Bolivia is well underway. Furthermore, the phasing out of assistance to Zambia, Benin and Cambodia has been initiated. Thereby, the number of partner countries will be reduced from 26 to 19 over the coming years. An extra DKK 175 million in 2012 will ensure a stronger Danish engagement in Africa, to which the main part of Danish development assistance will continue to be allocated.

In order to make further room for interventions within the five priority areas, the level of development assistance to a number of partner countries will be adjusted in the coming years. This will among others apply to countries where the character of Danish cooperation will change gradually towards more focus on the promotion of growth and employment following the positive development in these countries and their ability to take responsibility for their own development.

Denmark's multilateral development assistance will be further focused with emphasis on **efficiency and results**. Denmark can achieve greater impact by focusing on organisations that deliver results and where Denmark can gain influence. Denmark's support to the Global Fund to fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria will be reduced and Denmark will from 2012 discontinue assistance to the development activities of UNESCO, the UN's Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation.

# PRIORITIES FOR DANISH DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE

## **Freedom, democracy and human rights**

The changes in Northern Africa and the Middle East have confirmed the strength of the Western message of freedom, and freedom as a fundamental value and goal for Denmark's development policy. To support a development towards freedom and democracy especially in the Middle East and Northern Africa, DKK 125 million will be allocated in 2012 to the **Freedom Initiative. The Partnership for Dialogue and Reform** will be strengthened with DKK 25 million, making the total annual contribution DKK 125 million.

**Free media** is crucial for peoples' ability to hold governments to account. The Government will therefore in 2012 launch a special initiative to support the promotion of free media in developing countries.

**The rights** of all citizens must be respected, and they must have the freedom and possibility to take part in political processes. State building must be based on the rule of law with well functioning public institutions that are **free from corruption**. In 2012, DKK 75 million will be allocated to the promotion of democracy and respect for human rights in Niger and Burma, and DKK 135 million to good governance and state building in Afghanistan and the Palestinian Authority.

The long term overarching goal for Danish support to civil society is to contribute to the development of a **strong, independent and manifold civil society** in developing countries. Roughly DKK 1 billion will be provided to support the work of Danish NGOs in developing countries.

## **Growth and employment**

Increased economic growth and employment are preconditions for the ability of developing countries to finance their own development. As part of the implementation of the recommendations of the **Africa Commission**, support to the promotion of growth and employment in Africa will be gradually increased, ensuring an allocation of a total of DKK 2 billion annually in 2014 to this area. In 2012 Denmark will provide support in the order of DKK 150 million to the African Guarantee Fund. A further DKK 57 million will be provided to increase the equity in NORSAD – a joint financing initiative between the Nordic and Southern African (SADC) countries – in order to promote investments in Southern Africa.

The radical changes in the Middle East and Northern Africa stem to a large extent from social injustice and lack of job opportunities. Therefore, DKK 50 million is allocated to the **Freedom Investment Fund** under the Industrialisation Fund for Developing Countries (IFU) in order to promote growth and **generate employment** in the Middle East and Northern Africa.

The new **Danida Business Partnerships** aim, among other things, to improve framework conditions for local entrepreneurs, promote regional market development and develop partnerships that can contribute to the strengthening of all elements in the production chain from producer to consumer. The Danida Business Partnerships will be strengthened with DKK 50 million in 2012.

A higher degree of processing of agricultural products creates jobs and new income opportunities. Hence, DKK 710 million is allocated to new phases of the agricultural sector programmes in Burkina Faso and Bangladesh.

### **Gender equality**

Gender equality is a key priority in Denmark's development policy and is integrated across programmes and projects in Danish development assistance. Women and men must have **equal opportunities** to contribute to the development of their societies as well as equal economic, political and social rights. This also creates the best conditions for growth, employment and sustainable development.

In 2012, DKK 25 million is allocated to special **gender interventions** in Tanzania of which DKK 5 million will go to a pilot project that – as a part of the Goldman Sachs “10.000 Women” initiative – will provide poor and underserved women education in basic business management and leadership. A further DKK 28 million will be provided to a regional gender initiative in Northern Africa and the Middle East.

Getting an education is decisive for women's economic opportunities. Ensuring **girls' access to education** is a cornerstone of Danish support to education in Afghanistan, to which DKK 120 million is allocated in 2012.

### **Stability and fragility**

Fragile states constitute one of the most important challenges to peace, stability and security in the world. Simultaneously, they are among the countries which are the furthest from reaching the UN's Millennium Development Goals. With the Government's “Peace and stabilisation – Denmark's policy towards fragile states” (2010) as the point of departure, Denmark will give greater priority to supporting these countries in the years to come. The Government allocates DKK 1,020 million in 2012 to fragile states (excl. humanitarian assistance), including among others DKK 360 million to **Afghanistan** and

DKK 310 million to **Sudan**. A further DKK 35 million is allocated to the **inter-ministerial Global Framework for Integrated Stabilisation Efforts** (as well as a further DKK 85 million outside the development assistance budget) to support stabilisation, reconstruction and capacity building, especially in the Afghanistan-Pakistan region and in East Africa/the Horn of Africa. The multilateral track will also be strengthened with DKK 80 million to peace and stabilisation funds under the World Bank and the UN.

Denmark's humanitarian assistance will be strengthened with increased support to the UN's emergency assistance interventions. In 2012, the Government allocates more than DKK 1.4 billion to humanitarian assistance. Denmark places particular emphasis on delivering fast and targeted assistance when disaster strikes. For this reason, the contribution to UN's Central Emergency Response Fund, CERF, is doubled to DKK 100 million annually.

Strengthened support to the management and solution of the world's refugee problems is in the interest of both development countries and Denmark. Support to Denmark's **Regions of Origin Initiative** will be strengthened with DKK 25 million annually, and the Danish annual contribution to the UN High Commissioner for Refugees, UNHCR, is increased to a total of DKK 160 million.

### **Environment and climate**

Environment and climate concerns are integrated broadly into Danish development assistance. Environmental degradation, climate change or lack of access to energy deprive many poor people of their livelihood and ability to improve their situation. In 2012, DKK 635 million is allocated to environment, climate and energy interventions.

The Climate Envelope, which is a part of the Danish contribution to the international funding of climate interventions, will be increased to DKK 500 million in 2012. A further DKK 40 million will be allocated to the organisation IUCN (International Union for Conservation of Nature), along with DKK 60 million to the sustainable development of land and water resources in relation to food security. Another DKK 20 million will be allocated to the World Bank's Global Facility for Disaster Reduction and Recovery with a view to reducing the humanitarian consequences of natural disasters.

### **Research underpins the priorities for Denmark's development policy**

Activities within the five priority areas are underpinned by Danish development research. The Government increases the competitive research funds with DKK 60 million to 155 million in 2012, of which DKK 20 million are allocated to research in **vaccines** for among others HIV, malaria and tuberculosis. Apart from this, Denmark's support to development research will focus on i.a. Denmark's development priorities; growth and employment, as well as stability, democracy and rights.

*Appendix 1* illustrates that in 2012 new sector programmes and other large programmes in the 26 partner countries of a total of approximately DKK 3.6 billion will be launched.

The Danish Government hereby presents its priorities for Danish development assistance for the years 2012-2016. The priorities for Denmark's development assistance reflect the ongoing implementation of the Strategy for Denmark's Development Cooperation "Freedom from Poverty – Freedom to Change" which was launched in 2010.

With poverty reduction as the overarching goal, the strategy highlights five political priority areas for Denmark's future engagement on development: 1) Freedom, democracy and human rights, 2) growth and employment, 3) gender equality, 4) stability and fragility, and 5) environment and climate.

A stronger engagement in fewer countries and organisations creates impact, better results and room for new initiatives. The phasing out of assistance to a number of partner countries continues, reducing the number of partner countries from 26 to 19 over the coming years. Denmark's multilateral development assistance will also be further focused with emphasis on efficiency and results.

The Government will give greater priority to Denmark's engagement in fragile states in the years to come. The efforts to support democratic forces for freedom, especially in North Africa and the Middle East, will be markedly strengthened. As part of the implementation of the recommendations of the Africa Commission, support to the promotion of growth and employment in Africa will be gradually increased, ensuring an allocation of a total of DKK 2 billion annually in 2014 to this area.
